## Essential Project Pre-Learning

- Chronology: identifying dates set in AD/BC and BCE/CE including significant periods in history such as the Great Fire of London and Crimean War.
- Looking at different settlements and types of houses through history.

## Essential Project Learning

Skara Brae – A Neolithic settlement on the Orkney island of Mainland occupied from 3180 to 2500 BCE. Older than Stonehenge and the Great Pyramids of Egypt!



Stonehenge – A Neolithic monument in Wiltshire, England. Constructed from 3000 to 2000 BCE, it had many phases from a circular ditch, to a wooden structure, to standing stones we can still see today.



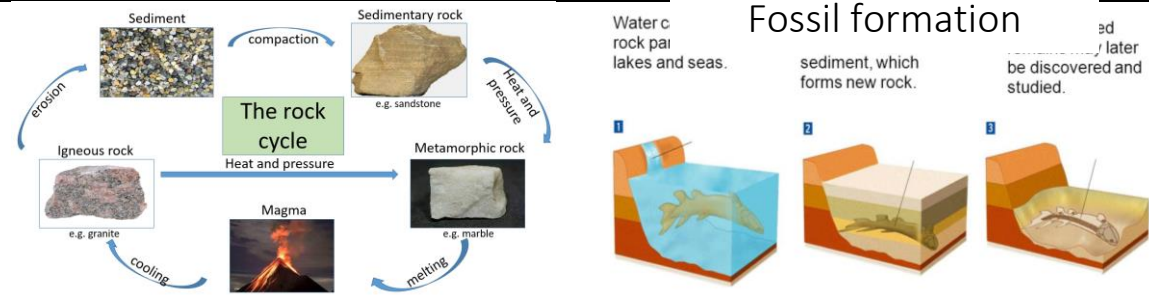
**Key inventions:**  
Flint

This hard rock splinters into thin, sharp flakes that could be made into knives, hand axes arrow heads and scrapers. This allowed people to be better hunters, build shelters and make warmer clothes.



**Shelters**

At the start of the Stone Age people sheltered in the nearest cave to the animals they were hunting. As time went by they built wooden structures that meant they could stay near land that was good for farming.

| <i>Palaeolithic</i>     | Early Stone Age                                                                                                |
| <i>Mesolithic</i>       | Middle Stone Age                                                                                               |
| <i>Neolithic</i>        | “New” Stone Age – last part of the Stone Age                                                                   |
| <i>Flint</i>            | A hard rock, which was shaped in Stone Age times to form tools and weapons                                     |
| <i>Sedimentary rock</i> | Rock that has been formed by layers of sediment (e.g. sand) pressing down on top of each other.                |
| <i>Metamorphic rock</i> | Igneous or sedimentary rock that has changed due to being exposed to extreme heat or pressure.                 |
| <i>Magma</i>            | Molten rock underground                                                                                        |
| <i>Rock cycle</i>       | The process of rock formation from molten rock to the 3 main type of solid rock and back to molten rock again. |
| <i>Igneous Rock</i>     | Rock which forms from magma as it cools.                                                                       |
| <i>Permeable</i>        | Allows liquid to pass through it.                                                                              |
| <i>Impermeable</i>      | Does not allow liquid to pass through                                                                          |
| <i>Lava</i>             | Molten rock above the ground, e.g. following a volcanic eruption                                               |

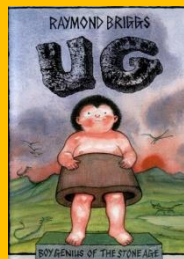
