Essential Project Pre-Learning

- Roman invasion of Egypt in 30BCE ended the reign of Cleopatra VII, and Ancient Egypt.
- Rivers give vital nutrients to the soil which allow crops to grow and societies to develop.
- Sources can be primary and secondary and they can have bias.



Essential Project Learning

- Egypt is located in North Africa with neighbouring countries of Libya and Sudan.

- The River Nile, that flows through Egypt, is the longest river in the world at 6670km long.

- The dynastic period started with the reign of Egypt's first king, Narmer, in approximately 3100 BCE
- Tutankhamun was a child pharaoh who reigned from 1332 to 1323 BC and his intact tomb was found in 1922 by Howard Carter



- The oldest pyramid was erected for King Zoser between 2667-2548BC
- The Pyramids of Giza are the only Wonder of the Ancient World still standing

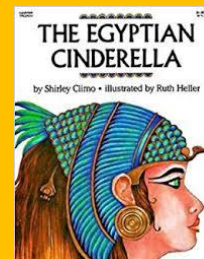
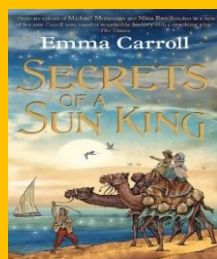
