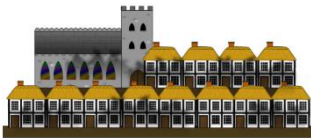

In 1666 most of the houses were made from wood and they were packed together tightly in narrow rows.		Early Sunday morning 2nd September 1666. 		London	London is the capital city of England.
		The fire starts at Thomas Farriner's bakery on Pudding Lane As the news of the fire spreads, people run to escape its path. 		River Thames	The River Thames is the longest river in England which flows through London to the North Sea.
The fire service didn't exist so people tried to put the fire out themselves.		Samuel Pepys starts his diary to record the events as they unfold.		The Tower of London	The Tower of London is a historic castle located on the North bank of the River Thames in central London.
		Houses are pulled down to try and stop the fire from spreading. Early Monday 3rd September 1666. 		Pudding Lane	Pudding Lane was a narrow street of wooden houses crowded together, many leaning out toward each other. Pudding Lane is where the Great Fire of London started.
We know a lot about the fire because Samuel Pepys wrote a diary about the events.		The River Thames is full of boats carrying people's possessions to safety. Carts are banned from going near the fire. 		Warehouse	A large building for storing goods. The area around Pudding Lane was full of warehouses containing highly flammable items including timber, rope and oil.
		The fire spreads close to The Great Tower of London St Paul's Cathedral is destroyed. 		Escape	To break free.
		The fire spreads more slowly because the wind has died down. Thursday 6th September 1666. 		Samuel Pepys	Samuel Pepys worked for the English government and wrote a diary account of the disasters throughout The Great Fire of London.
		The fire is finally put out.		Diary	A book in which a person writes about what they have seen, heard or what they have been doing.
				Destroyed	Completely ruined.
				City	A city is a large town. The Great Fire of London took place in the city of London.
				Bakery	A place where bread and cakes are made or sold.
				Thomas Farriner	Thomas Farriner was the owner of the Pudding Lane bakery where the fire started.

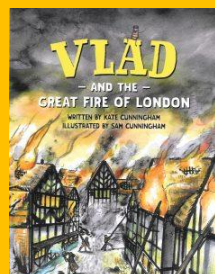
