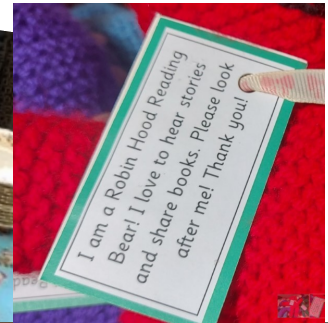

Robin Hood Reading Round-up



Over the year, we have given out over 200 afternoon teas, 250 books and 200 keyrings as a part of our celebrations of reading in school! Well done to all of our children who have achieved these!



We have also given out 26 reading bears to our F2 children who have completed our reading challenge this year—these were hand knitted by our own very talented Ms Richardson! Well done!



Mrs Habgood is currently reading *Hilda the Troll* by Luke Pearson. I will add a review to my next Reading Assembly.

Throughout the year, we have held second hand book sales to raise money for new books for school and to share some wonderful books with our school community. We have raised over **£210** through these sales—thank you to Ms Millington, our Reading Club and our wonderful school community for supporting this,



Across school, we expect children to read at home 5 days a week and have this recorded in their Learning Log. These are then 'handed in' to school to be checked each week and children move along their reading reward system in their classes each week if they have read 5 days. Each term, the children who have read 5 days a week each week get to choose a prize! They could earn 3 rewards over the year! Remember that they can read any text—fiction/non fiction/their school book or a comic/magazine.
