

Year 3 Spring Term Project: Which invention had the most impact?

Roman Timeline	
55BC	Julius Caesar’s first raid of Britain. The Celts fought back and the Romans returned to Gaul (France).
54BC	Julius Caser’s second attempt at an invasion. This time he succeeded in defeating some Celtic tribes.
43 AD	Claudius successfully invades Britain. Many Celts now obey the Romans and pay taxes. Some continue to rebel.
59 AD	Boudicca’s husband Prasutagus dies. Under Roman law Boudicca cannot inherit his land. When the Romans come to claim it she refuses.
60 AD	Boudicca’s Iceni tribe joins forces with other Celts, and successfully attack the Roman cities of Colchester, St Albans and London.
61 AD	The Romans, defeat the Celts at the battle of Watling Street. Boudicca dies.
122 AD	The Romans continue to try to invade Caledonia. They fail, and Hadrian orders a 117km wall to be built to defend the Roman territory.
300 AD	Roman emperor Constantine converts to Christianity. The faith is then spread across the Roman empire including Britain.
410 AD	Roman rule in Britain ends as the Romans retreat to defend their land in Rome.

Important Historical Figures	
Boudicca – Warrior queen of the Iceni Tribe, formed an army to battle against the Romans.	
Julius Caesar – Emperor of Rome who attempted to invade Britain but failed.	
Claudius – Emperor of Rome whose army successfully invaded parts of Britain.	
Hadrian – Emperor of Rome who ordered Hadrian’s wall to be built to defend their land from the Picts (a Celtic tribe in Scotland)	

Key Science knowledge	
Plants	
Plants have developed many ways to disperse their seeds. They use the wind, water and animals – including humans to scatter their seeds far from the parent plant.	

Language Dozen		
Romans	invade	To enter a country with a large army.
	conquer	To take control of a country by force.
	empire	A group of countries ruled over by one leader.
	emperor	The leader of the Roman Empire.
	mosaic	A pattern made from coloured pieces of stone and pottery.
	aqueduct	A system of pipes and channels which brings clean water into towns.
Plants	roots	These anchor the plant into the ground and absorb water and nutrients from the soil
	stem	This holds the plant up and carries water and nutrients from the soil to the leaves.
	leaves	These make food for the plant using sunlight and carbon dioxide from the air.
	flowers	These make seeds to grow into new plants. Their petals attract pollinators to the plant
	nutrients	These substances are needed by living things to grow and survive. Plants get nutrients from the soil and also make their own food in their leaves.
	photosynthesis	The process that plants use to use sunlight and carbon dioxide to make their own food.

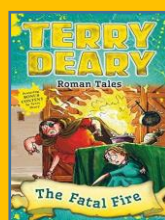
