Pupil Premium Allocation 2019 - 2020

What is Pupils Premium?

Pupil Premium is additional funding for publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers. This funding is aimed at addressing the current underlying inequalities that exist between children from disadvantaged and non-disadvantaged backgrounds.

This funding is allocated to schools on the basis of the number of pupils who have been eligible for Free School Meals at any point over the last six years, children who have been “looked after” for more than six months, children who have left local authority care or children of service personnel.

The DFE has given us the freedom to use the Pupil Premium as we see fit, based on the knowledge of our pupils’ needs.

Disadvantaged Pupils at Robin Hood

There are 144 (34%) pupils on the Pupil Premium register

112 of PP pupils are FSM (78%).

32 of PP pupils are non-FSM (22%).

115 (24%) pupils are on the SEND register

49/115 (43%) of these children are SEND **and** PP

Pupil Premium Provision

Pupil Premium Provision maps in each year group outline the support that is in place for children in receipt of Pupil Premium. This includes: high-quality, first class teaching; specific interventions; support from the nurture team and Brainy Breakfast.

Pupil Premium Funding

For the financial year 2019 - 20, Robin Hood Primary School has been allocated a total of **£239, 498**
