



Robin Hood Primary School

Pupil Premium Allocation 2018 - 2019

Historically, country wide, children in receipt of Free School Meals (FSM) have achieved less well academically. In order to improve outcomes for this group of children, the Government introduced extra funding (pupil premium) for all pupils who are currently in receipt of FSM from April 2011.

From April 2012 pupils who have received FSM at any time within the past 6 years are included. This funding has been made available to tackle disadvantage and to raise attainment.

For the financial year 2018 - 19, Robin Hood Primary School has been allocated a total of **£238, 780**
