Dear Parents and Carers,

The current situation around Coronavirus in the UK is changing every day and I know causing anxiety for many. Schools are – as you know – open at this time. We will however be putting into place some measures to try and manage the situation as best as we can whilst continuing in schools until directed otherwise by the government.

All children	All children will wash hands at the start of the school day. During the school day. Before eating food.
All children	To limit footfall through the door, we will be asking parents from *Wednesday morning* to drop and collect their children at the door. Nursery children – staff will be at the two green doors – children will continue to go to their keyworker area. Children collected from green door. Reception & Year 1 – dropped at classroom door. Collected from classroom door Year 2 – dropped at door into Year 2 Shared area. Collected from classroom doors at back. KS2 – enter through main doors and collected as usual outside. Visitors will be limited in school and asked to take additional care re hygiene.
All children	Events where parents have been asked to attend will be postponed. Events after school outside of regular clubs cancelled. Project outcomes we intended to share with parents will be postponed but videoed if they still go ahead with children present and uploaded onto the website.
All children	Parent Learner Reviews / SEND Reviews / Assemblies will continue as usual with measures in place. Trips – will continue (risk assessments carried out daily dependent on where children are going to) e.g. Southglade Library, Twcross Zoo
We are – and will continue - to follow guidance and directives from Public Health England (PHE) and the Government as the country continues in its Delay Strategy.	
Cleaning: We contract the Local Authority to provide cleaning for the school. Cleaners are very good and are ensuring they take additional measures to keep our site clean and well prepared e.g. additional soaps / areas sanitised daily etc.

Remote learning will consist of:

- Exercise Book - blank / work booklets of photocopied learning sent out with children. (Reading Books sent out alongside Learning Log)
- Class email groups set up: Class teacher will communicate to parents of pupils in class and email out learning tasks on a daily basis. *We will try out a practice run this week*
- Teacher input videos introducing lesson / objectives / teaching points will be uploaded onto Pupils / Video Resource Section of the school website
- Mathematics / TT Rockstars / BUG CLUB / Purple Mash all available – log ins in Learning Logs
- Y4 and Y5 - Take home ipads - continue directing work flow via Showbie. Parents will need to respond to an email which will be sent out this week to give consent for this.

Our Remote Learning Strategy is intended to be varied so as to "catch all" regardless of the ICT availability / internet access in individual pupil homes. Also if one method fails: e.g. overload of website re documents - there are back up systems in place.

In the event of school closure due to Coronavirus, teachers will be available to parent emails coming in / going out during school hours.
