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CAUSES OF WW2

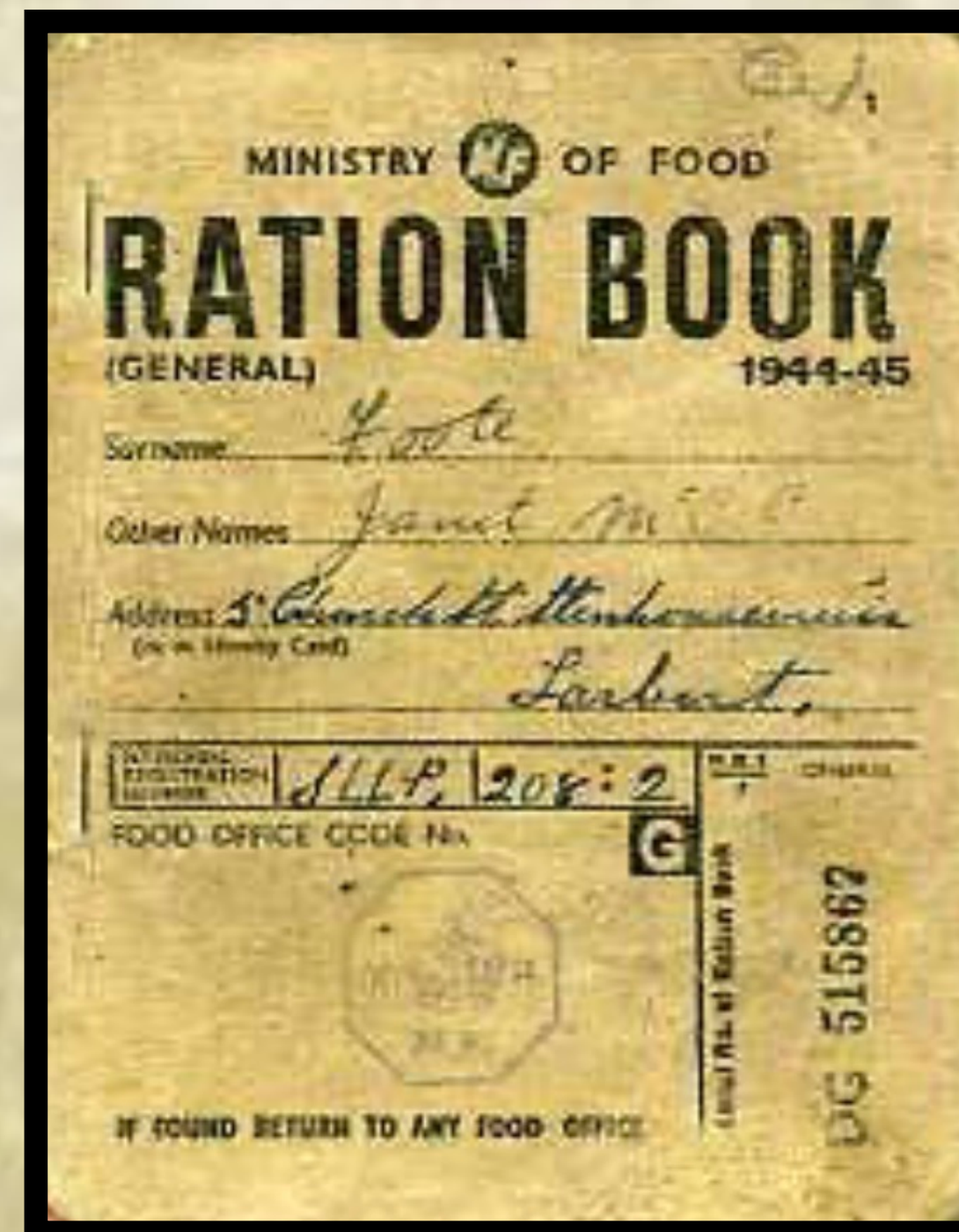

Evacuation:

TO KNOW THE IMPACT OF WW2 ON CHILDREN:

Education:

The children all went to a new school in the countryside. Everyone had no clue where they were going. People learned many new things there. The war disturbed their education a lot. Over 2000 schools were used for war use. The air raids made them not learn for 2-3 hours. Attendance was poorly, and also they didn't have many supplies.



TO KNOW THE IMPACT OF WW2 ON CHILDREN:

Work:

Some women had many men jobs while the men went to the army. Children between 14-17 had jobs. (Engineering, aircraft production, ship building and others) People between 16-18 had to work in the army. Children under 14 were expected to do jobs.





THE BLITZ:



The Blitz targeted cities that had more people and important stuff. (London, Sheffield, Birmingham and etc) They bombed areas like factories and ports so it was harder for the British to move and fight. The Blitz targeted other countries as well.

To help with this, people hid in Anderson shelters that protected them during the bombing. These were usually in their back garden or in their houses. When a building was destroyed, the bricks would fall on the shelters and it wouldn't break! How helpful is that!
