The anderson shelters were very useful and they could be in your garden or in your house. They are used to make sure that no items can come flying hurt you.

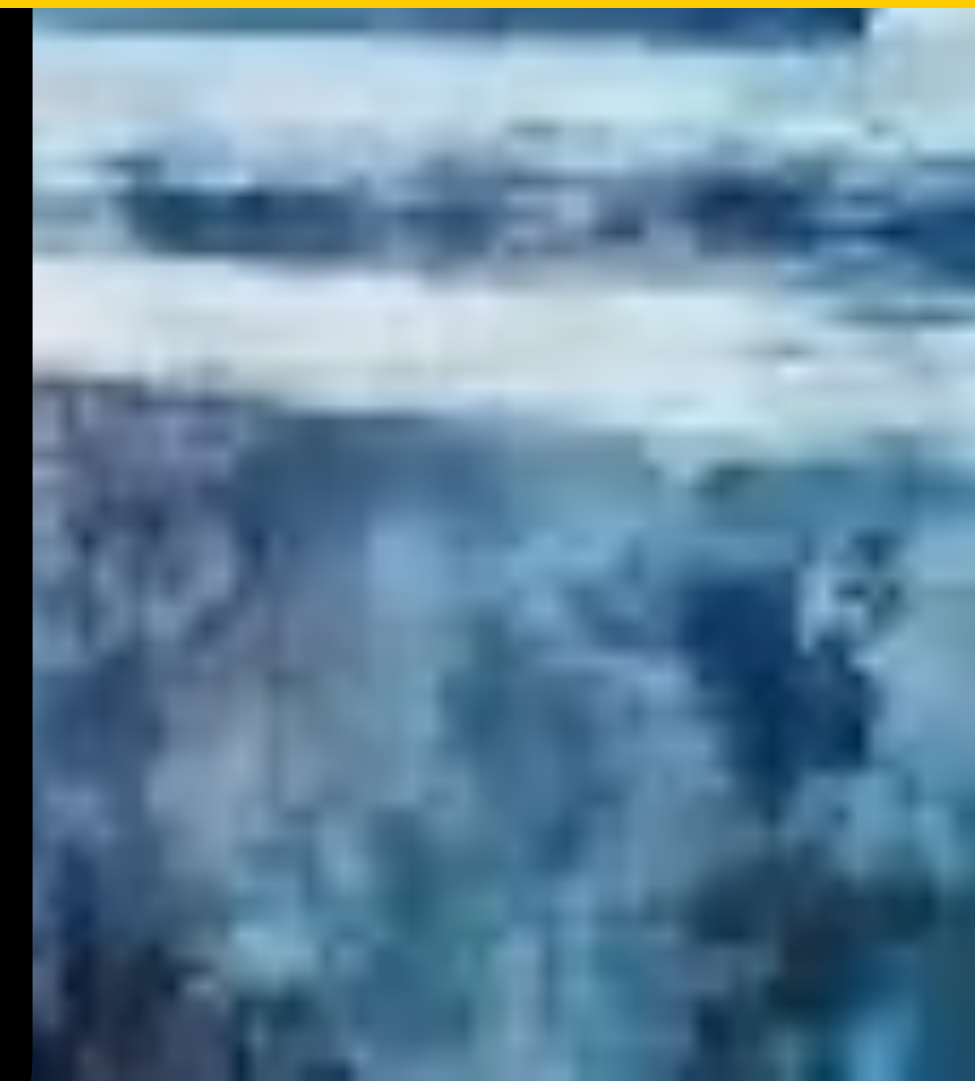


BLITZ

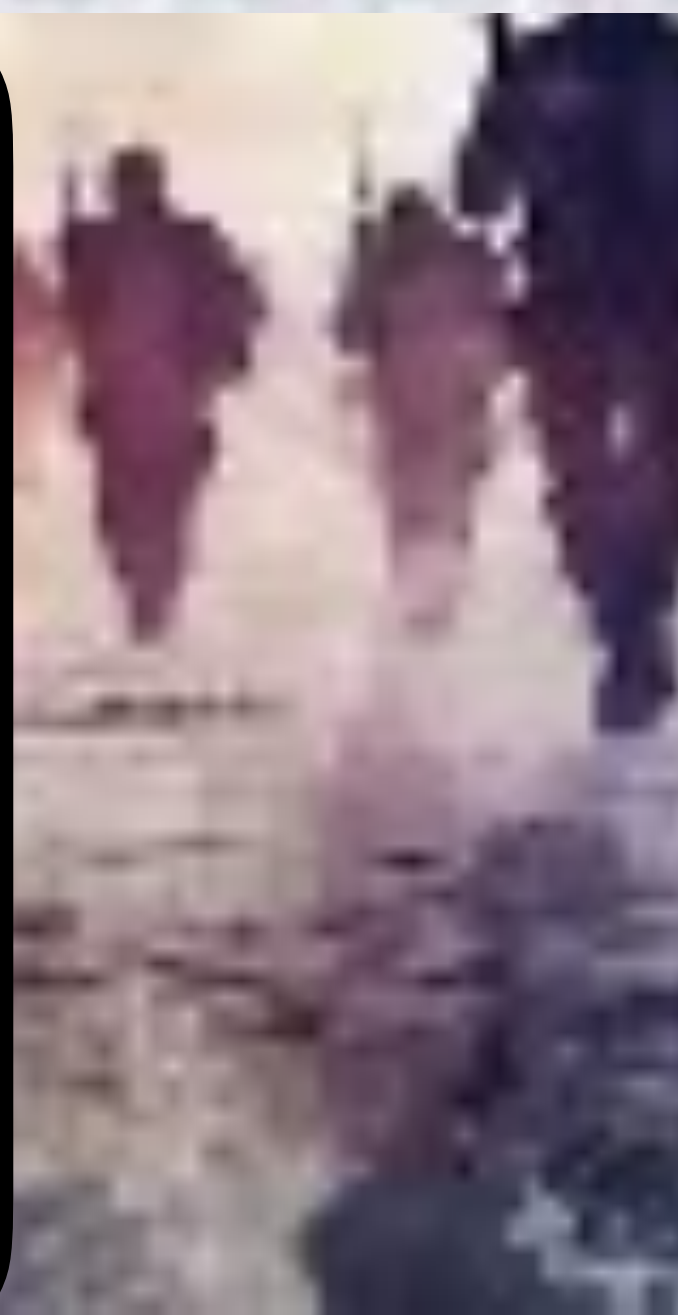

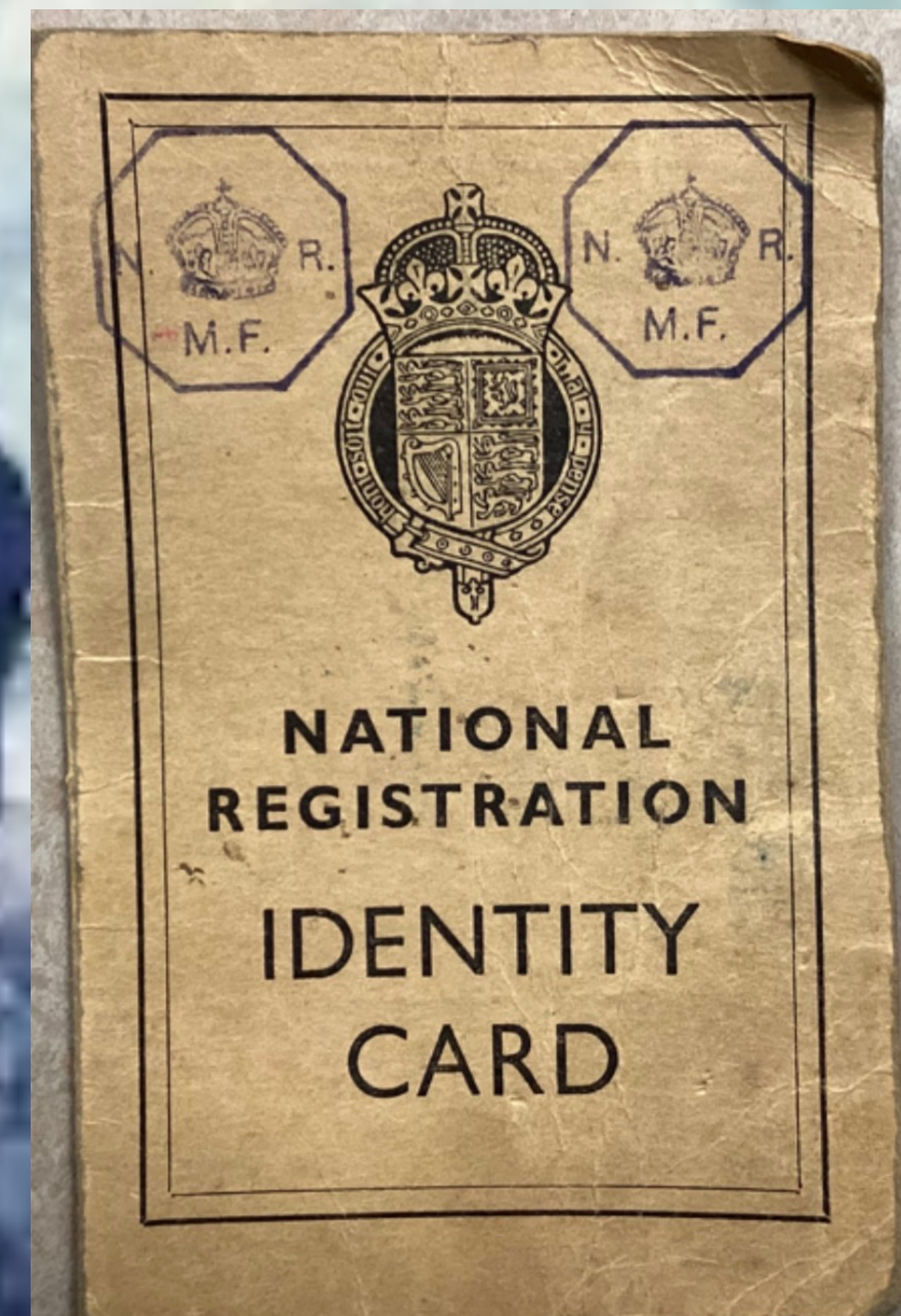
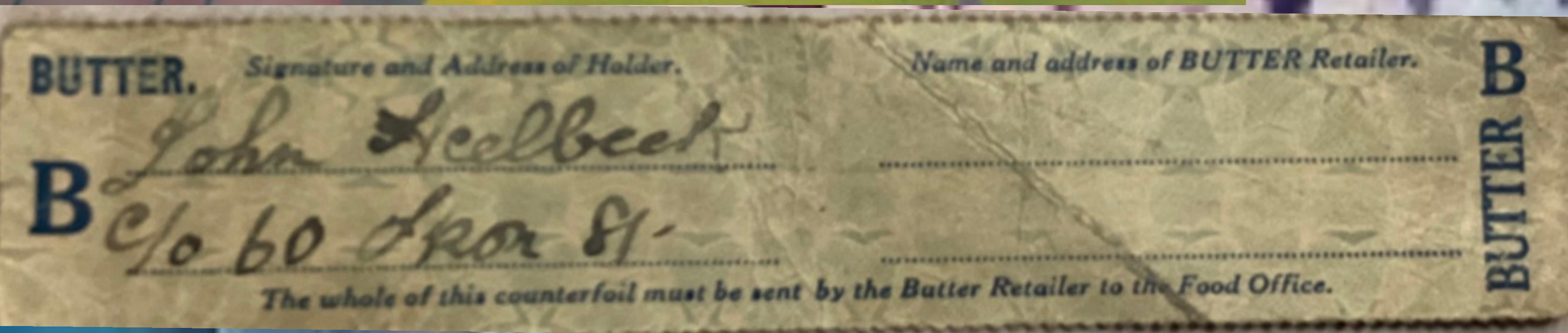
