Our crochet club have also been beavering away, showing such patience and perseverance as they develop their skills – it is always lovely to see children so absorbed in their learning and so proud of what they create.

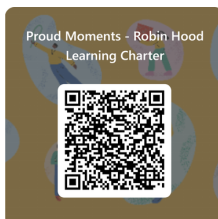

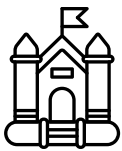
We are half way through the half term already, time flies when you're having fun! In the next few weeks these things are happening across school:

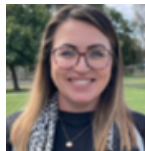
