Dear Parents / Carers,

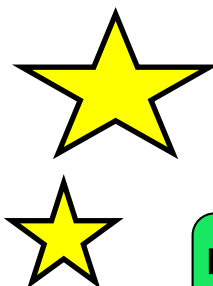

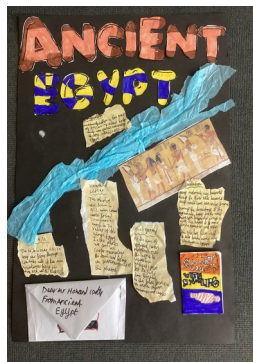

Parents/carers are invited into school, after school next Weds 3rd December, to see the children's project work. Please come into classes at 3.30pm to see work described here on the right.

This is Jainaba in Class Knights project work about Ancient Egypt



Year group	Project Work to see in Classes at 3.30pm on Weds 3rd Dec
F2	The short Christmas film that the children made with Adam Pepper last Friday will be shown several times.
Year 1	Children will find famous people throughout History around the classroom and give reasons why they are amazing.
Year 2	Rainforest writing in English books. Deforestation posters. Art books and project to show run up to rainforest fashion show.
Year 3	Taste testing of healthy snack from DT, Stone Age activities from the theme day and sharing of curriculum and portfolio work.
Year 4	Children will have created replicas of various Anglo-Saxons and Viking artefacts, each explaining its use and significance during that historical period.
Year 5	Children will have their sketch books/art work out to showcase what they have produced as part of our project on the Ancient Greeks, as well as writing portfolios.
Year 6	Each child will present their answers to the essential question in the form of an A3 poster. This will include text, images and 3D elements to make it interactive and interesting.
