4th 5th 6th 7th August 2025

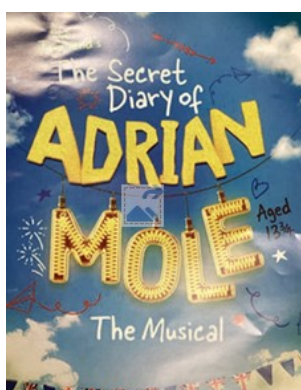
